God took me through a long journey to help me see that my most important mission field is at home. My heart is still for the children specifically in Berks County, but God has reminded me that my children need to come first.

In the beginning of the year as I prayed, God confirmed that the ministry of CEF will always be a part of my life. That was the calling He placed on my heart while I was at Summer Missionary Training School in 2007 using Philippians 1:6, "Being confident of this very thing, that He which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ." As I prayed about that verse after Chapel, I knew God wanted me to be more involved with CEF. Little did I know that would lead me to working part-time in the Philly CEF Office while finishing college and then full-time there as a Field Worker after graduation and then bringing me home to be the Director in Berks County ten years ago. God confirmed my involvement in CEF early this year by having my ministry verse (Philippians 1:6) show up everywhere, and I mean everywhere. The same thing happened Junior year of College as I prayed about being a missionary with CEF or being a public-school teacher.

Although God confirmed my involvement, He impressed upon my heart the need to be home with my children. My family has been great watching them while I am at the office or out teaching, but God has not called them to raise my children. That is my and Andy's responsibility, our calling. God has made that very clear to us. We are to raise our children, not extended family, which means I need to be home more.

At Summer Missionary Training School this Summer during Chapel, Doug reminded us that our calling does not change and mine has not. God called me to be involved with CEF, and I will continue to be involved; however, I cannot continue in the capacity I am now as Director as I need to be home with my children. God is not changing my calling, but He has changed my assignment.

I will continue to teach a Good News Club and help with Teacher Training Classes and Camp. I will help Matthew anyway I can in the transition because I love this ministry.



Stepping down from full-time ministry after 14 years terrifies me since it is all I have ever known but God has given me so much peace now that I have finally surrendered to God's reassignment, motherhood. Excitement has begun to bubble up inside over the thought of pouring into my two precious children which

May the joy of the Lord be your strength, Sara (Atwood) Bowers




Rachel Joy Bowers will be turning 1 on December 27. She loves anything that crinkles, our cats, anything soft and cute, food, and any toy her brother has.
